A Key Next Step -Affirming Charter Signatories

he Partnership is entering a critical phase in the development of an integrated water management plan. This phase of the project includes the development of strategies and actions that meet the goals and objectives that have been defined by the partnership since September of 2016.

The Plan Development Team would like to initially engage with charter signatories to draft the strategies, and will share the progress in developing and prioritizing these strategies with all partners in the Mid-Coast region at key points throughout the process. All partners will have an opportunity to review, comment on, and share perspectives on the proposed draft strategies.

Because the MCWPP has a charter, it is important to affirm:

- Current charter signatories, both specific individuals and affiliations (recognizing that agencies and other organizations have turnover through time)
- Charter signatories willing to participate in a series of eight 90-minute meetings in January and February.

Alexandria Scott, the MCWPP Local Planning Coordinator, will be reaching out to you in the next several weeks to affirm charter signatories and develop a list of signatories willing and able to participate in the strategy development meetings in early 2021 (note: a charter signatory is not required to participate in all eight meetings, but should be willing to participate in at least four of the meetings).



They presented the different web-based tools and resources that are being used in the Mid-Coast to make technical information more accessible:

- A series of visually appealing, easily navigable web-pages on our new website, <u>www.midcoastwater-partners.com</u>, created to translate the lengthy Step 2 technical documents summarizing water conditions in the Mid-Coast region;
- A Story Map that is being developed to convey high-level concepts from Step 2 and Step 3 to the general public; and
- Examples from the Oregon Explorer and how it can be used to support planning and implementation.

he Plan Development Team convened with the Coordinating Committee in October to discuss next steps in the development of the Mid-Coast water plan. Alexandria provided an update on the status of the storymap by BlueWater GIS consultants, noting the storymap would be produced in both English and Spanish versions, and completed by the end of the year. The Plan Development Team is mining past documents and convening with the Coordinating Committee to obtain their input and perspectives on developing the framework for the plan prior to convening with stakeholders in early 2021. A key goal is to prevent duplication of effort and be as efficient as possible moving forward.
