Prioritization Approaches Discussion

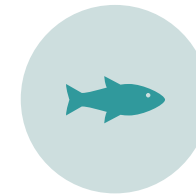
Method 1: Action Benefit Criteria



Improves water quantity



Improves water quality



Both instream and out-of-stream benefits



Regionwide benefit



Helps implement a state or regional plan



Improves stakeholder understanding

5-6 points = Group A

3-4 points = Group B

0-2 points = Group C

Method 2: Readiness and Urgency Criteria



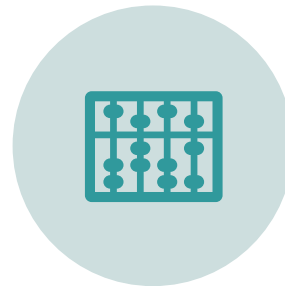
Eligible for ARPA funding
or partially funded



Urgency/emergency



Readiness



Concept development
(up to 2 points)

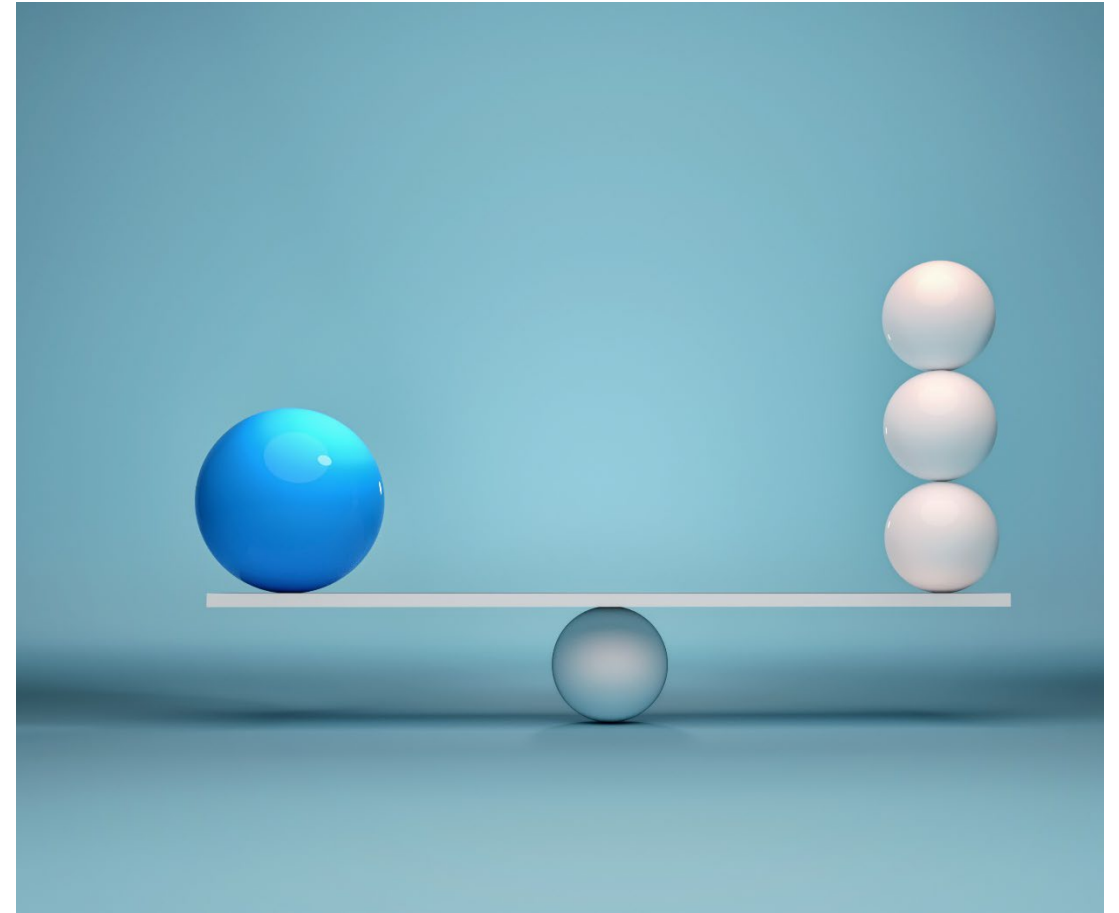
4-5 points = Group A

2-3 points = Group B

0-2 points = Group C

Method 1a: Overall Score

- All criteria are considered
 - 8-11 points = Group A
 - 4-7 points = Group B
 - 0-3 points = Group C



Test Run: walk- through



Feedback on Approaches

- Readiness and capacity (staffing) to implement actions is very important.
- Methods 1a and 2 are responsive to opportunities
- The con of Method 1a is having a lot of actions in Group B
- Method 1a with many actions falling into Group B is not necessarily negative
- There is a lot of merit to Method 1a because it combines benefits and readiness/urgency
- Use method 1 and then apply readiness; broaden the range of scores
