Summary of Major Points of Discussion

- Suzanne explained that more detailed Prioritization Work Group meeting notes will be provided in the future, and will identify questions that need to be answered, decisions made, GSI action items, and Partners action items
- Suzanne described that GSI has identified potential updates to the Charter to help address
 questions about the role of the Partnership and that the Water Action Plan has been completed.
 Changes are focused on adding language about Water Action Plan implementation support.
- Suzanne explained that she plans to share with the Prioritization Work Group that travel reimbursement will be available by filling out a form and that organizations meeting financial support can provide letters to the Coordinating Committee explaining why financial support is needed
- Suzanne discussed a potential prioritization approach that uses the Decision Support System that
 could be brought to the Prioritization Work Group. The potential approach focused on
 implementability for the criteria (such as eligibility for funding, availability of funding and other
 resources, and action/project readiness) as a starting place
- Mike stated that major goals/themes of the MidCoast Watersheds Council are conservation and watershed restoration
- Adam and Mike expressed interest in a prioritization process that focuses on overarching needs
 and then implementability to encourage a balanced representation of projects and to help
 ensure that greatest concern/needs are addressed, even those lacking a current champion
- Billie Jo proposed an approach where a project lead presents its project to the Partnership and identifies what action the project fits under, and then the Partnership figures out how to support the project. A later phase would involve identifying projects that are high priority.

- Suzanne stated that she would develop an updated, expanded prioritization process approach to share with the Prioritization Work Group that integrates criteria related to overarching needs earlier in the process
- Mike asked about longer-term support to continue Partnership efforts, and suggested reaching
 out to Lincoln County to help support the Partnership. Adam explained that the County did help
 at an early stage, provided background on the evolution of the Partnership, and said that it
 would be worthwhile to reach out to Lincoln County again
- Adam shared Aaron Collett from the City of Newport will attend the next Prioritization Work
 Group meeting to address questions about the Newport dams project and thinks the mayor of
 Toledo may attend
